The Alliance has been reporting cost and quality information through its *QualityCounts* reports for more than 10 years. The reports provide information on the cost and quality of care for inpatient and outpatient procedures at providers that the organization contracts with. The Alliance's performance-based reimbursement program rewards providers for high quality care.

Rigsby will be responsible for recruiting members to the employer-owned cooperative. The Alliance was formed as a cooperative 20 years ago by seven Madison-area employers looking for a way to lower their health care costs. The founding members chose the cooperative structure to allow participating employers to share both the responsibility and the benefits of membership. Today more than 160 self-funded members providing coverage to more than 83,000 individuals in Wisconsin, Illinois and Iowa call themselves members of The Alliance. Together they work cooperatively to lower costs, improve quality and engage individuals in their health.
